


My child feels unwell, what should I do?



Additional, related questions we have had from parents so far:

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| <p>One of my children feels unwell. Do my other children have to stay at home as well?</p> | <p>Follow the flow chart on page 1. If the child that is unwell has any of the symptoms of COVID then the whole family should stay at home as shown on the diagram. If the child is unwell due to a different symptom then only the unwell child needs to remain at home. Hopefully whatever symptoms your child is showing they will get better quickly.</p> |
| <p>I'm not feeling well. Can I still come and drop off and pick up?</p> | <p>If symptoms of COVID then no and your child/children should not be in Nursery. You should all follow the guidance from NHS and the government and isolate until the person with symptoms of COVID has been tested then follow the appropriate next steps. If unwell with a different condition then yes of course just remember to keep hygiene levels high and maintain good social distancing.</p> |

Support for staff advising parents and carers

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| <p>Parent asks for advice about a cough</p> | <p>If a child has a new persistent cough then the whole household should remain at home and seek advice from NHS 111 or go ahead and book a test for the unwell child. Staff are not medically trained so take care giving advice. Signpost to support and guidance. Take cautious action - e.g. if a parent is unsure if the cough meets the criteria and is going to take advice then follow the 'stay at home' guidance until the parent or carer has been able to access medical advice.</p> |
